According to the Wisconsin State Statutes, parents/guardians are required to send their child to school on time each day, for the full day in which classes are held. A student is considered habitually truant when he/she misses all or any part of a school day for five (5) days in a semester.

According to Wisconsin State Law and Municipal Ordinances in both the City of Kenosha and the Village of Pleasant Prairie, students who have been found to be habitually truant shall be subject to any of the following dispositions which are deemed available to the Courts:

- Suspension of person's driving privileges
- Counseling, work program, or community service work
- Order to attend school
- Forfeiture of not more than \$500.00
- Order to remain at home
- Curfew
- Order to attend an education program (Sec.938.34 (7d))
- Placed under formal or informal supervision
- Revocation of work permit
- Order person's parent/guardian to counseling
- Order to be placed in a teen court program
- Order to report to youth report center

We would like the opportunity to meet with you regarding this matter, and hope that we can work together to improve this situation. Failure to work with the school to resolve this problem could result in legal action.

Compulsory School Attendance Law:

118.15 (1)(a) Any person having under their control a child who is between 6 and 18 years shall cause the child to attend school regularly during the full period and hours, religious excepted, that the public or private school in which the child should be enrolled is in session....

(3)(a) The school attendance officer may request the parent or guardian of the child to obtain a written statement from a licensed physician, dentist, chiropractor, optometrist, psychologist or Christian Science practitioner...as sufficient proof of the physical or mental condition of the child.

(b) "Truancy" means an absence of part of all of one or more days from school during which the school attendance officer, principal, or teacher has not been notified of the legal cause of such absence by the parent or guardian of the absent pupil and also means intermittent attendance carried on for the purpose of defeating the intent of s. 118.15.
