Much of her life was dedicated to putting others first. She was a dedicated leader and activist for quality education for all children attending our schools and living in our community. Mary Lou Mahone was the first black PTSA President in Kenosha and charter member of the Boys and Girls Club of Kenosha.

Each year, we present our Mary Lou Mahone award to a deserving eighth grade student who goes above the quadrants in the Circle of Courage. This is a student who has shown a dedication towards Mahone Middle School and his/her community. This is a student who has the potential to continue a lifetime of pursuing excellence, displaying unselfish acts of generosity and a commitment to serve so that everyone succeeds. Middle School meals offer a variety of choices. Students who receive free/reduce lunches are required to purchase a FULL meal. Students must purchase three of the five choices to complete a FULL meal. No a la carte items are included in a FULL meal. Beginning this school year, **CASH WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED AT THE LUNCHROOM REGISTERS**. All lunch accounts will need to be managed through MySchoolBuck.com or for families with no Internet, Envelopes are available in the office. **Cafeteria envelopes must be dropped off in the office before 9:00am** for the money to be available the same day. There is NO CREDIT for lunches at middle school. Students must have a balance to purchase a meal in order to receive a meal.

Our philosophy and culture is based on the belief that we need to address and nurture our students' wellbeing if they are to successfully engage in school. Mahone Middle School's philosophy and culture is built around the **Circle of Courage**. This framework is used as a tool for two major components of our school's culture. One, it is a means of helping students be independent with a strong sense of self and identity. Two, we want to use the Circle to create and foster a community of learners within the school.

The Circle is based on four universal growth needs of all children: **Belonging, Mastery, Independence, and Generosity**. When a person's Circle is complete, they are in harmony with the world, things are good. When the Circle is broken in one or more of the four quadrants, a person is experiencing difficulties or life challenges.

BELONGING - BE HERE *"Be related, somehow, to everyone you know."* -Ella Deloria

- Make our school a safe place. Mahone is a place where people feel emotionally and physically safe.
- Take the time to talk with others and let them know they are accepted; let everyone know we are glad they are here.
- In an assembly let the people on stage know they belong at Mahone, honor their words and actions with attentive listening.

At Mahone all students should feel as though they belong to the school. This takes place through the various after school activities ranging from our sports teams, our excellent music programs, and many different clubs. Every student in the school should feel as though there is one adult in the school who will be an advocate for them. Belonging builds community and allows us to accept everyone.

MASTERY - BE YOUR BEST *everyone is responsible for their learning and behavior*

- Be in class every day, on time with your mind.
- Be your best in organizing your materials.
- Master the steps to starting and ending each class successfully.
- Be your best by challenging yourself to achieve.
- Be your best in thinking and making wise choices.

At Mahone, we expect all students will always try their best. This could mean they achieve straight A's or they achieve straight C's stressing that aspect of themselves no matter their ability level. We want to help students build self-control and responsibility striving to achieve their individual goals. We will help students to do their best!

At Mahone, Independence is about being self-disciplined. Our goal is to help foster students to become self-disciplined and taking ownership of their educational and behavioral successes or failures.

- Say "hello" with a smile or handshake.
- Show "courtesy" by opening doors for others (real doors and the doors to success for all Mahone students).
- Give people space in the hallway (stay to the right), walk in a respectful way.
- Honor others as they work, don't distract others from doing their job.

At Mahone, all students should be kind to one another and all others at our school. This can be as simple as saying hi to everyone in the morning, holding a door open for someone, helping a person who has dropped their books, or getting involved in the schools generosity initiatives.
